Message from Pastor Jim: More Than an Opinion

A wonderful thing happened in church on Sunday recently! Some might call it an "unintended consequence" - my initial reaction. I now see it as a God-incident, through which the Holy Spirit was working.

On Sunday, July 21, we asked the question in worship, "Why do people need the Church?" The congregation then participated in an instant for being a faith community that knows why we online poll. We responded to the question, choosing five of ten possible reasons why people might need the Church. Using smartphones we selected our top five reasons out of the ten listed. Several who were not able to participate with a smartphone completed and turned in a paper version of the poll. Based on the overall number of responses, 57 people/ couples/families participated.

And here are the results: "Grow in faith" was the reason most of you chose, with 89% selecting this as one of their five. Second, 80% of you selected "Encounter God" as one of the reasons people need the Church. Coming in third, 75% chose "Supportive Community"; and in fourth, 66% chose "Serve Together". "Experiencing Forgiveness", the topic for my sermon, was the fifth reason chosen, with 49% selecting it as one of the five. Participants included all ages in worship, from youth to older adults.

As I later compiled the results from PollEv.com and added in the paper results, the Holy Spirit revealed through our collective responses why we believe LUMC exists, and what our church has to offer. Your responses, in a Spirit-inspired way, reminded us that LUMC exists to Know Christ (Encounter God), to Grow in Christ (Grow

in Faith, Supportive Community), and to Show Christ (Serve Together). And, while many may not be able to quote our vision statement, your responses also bore witness to our LUMC vision that we become "Followers of Jesus-One with God and each other-Ministers to all the world."

Thank you, Leesburg United Methodist Church, exist and what we are called to do as we welcome all to come and KNOW Christ, to GROW in Christ, and to SHOW Christ through witness and service!

And to think, this came to light from an instant online poll... a sign of the Spirit at work? Yes! Now, may God continue to empower and bless us to live out and live into our calling.

To God be the glory in the Church and in the world - beginning with you and me.

Summer Worship: "Growing Together in Community"

The phrases, "individual Christian", "personal faith", and "personal relationship with Jesus" are almost oxymoronic. The Christian faith is not lived in isolation; and when one acknowledges Christ as Savior and Lord, one immediately enters into relationship with every other Christian – past, present, and future – as a member of the body of Christ. Christian faith is meant to be lived in community, not in isolation. When the founder of Methodism, the Rev. John Wesley, declared "The gospel of Christ knows no religion, but social..." (Works of John Wesley, Vol 14, p.321), he emphasized the essential requirement of Christian community for growth in grace, love, and holiness.

During the time of year that we are most likely to not be together, we nonetheless turn our focus to the centrality of Christian community for shaping our faith and helping us live faithfully. During July and August, we're looking together at creative ways to connect in community in response to Hebrews 10 – "Let's"



see how inventive we can be in encouraging love and helping out, not avoiding worshiping together as some do but spurring each other on,..." (verse 25).



Summer Reading Plan

Explore the period of the early church and their trials and triumphs

This summer, explore the period of the early church and their trials and triumphs through daily readings in the New Testament Letters and the Book of Acts. These readings will enrich your walk with Jesus as we continue through the narrative of Scripture.



As you read, imagine you are sitting in a church: a small church in the country or perhaps an old European cathedral. Imagine others (from any time period) sitting around you and hearing the words of Scripture. Allow the words to connect you in space and time to Christians around the world and throughout time.

"... Let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect." - Romans 12:2 (NLT)

ABOUT THE READINGS: The Letters readings are inserted between the Acts readings at approximately the points when they were written. The "...Overview Video" links will take you to a video that gives some background and overview of each respective book. Some of the readings have dates noted—for Acts they are the dates when that part of the story is believed to have taken place; for the Epistles the dates are when they were believed to have been written.

REACH Roanoke Trip Report: July 6–12

This year, the youth mission trip was to REACH in Roanoke after 14 years of going to SPY in Christiansburg. The first few days, everyone adjusted to the different building and other changes that were inevitable with a new place.

Money through Friday, the focus was on serving the people of Roanoke. One of the struggles for many of our youth was that they would not have a "homeowner" to interact with like they did at SPY. Eventually, the houses they worked on would become homes for families, but they missed that connection during the work. The neat thing about REACH, though, was the ability to connect with many different people. I felt like the church was the homeowner, or the woman who runs the Christian Soldiers Food Pantry who was so grateful for the work our teams did, or the man who runs the Rescue Mission who came and talked with us about using our "hands, feet, and praise" to serve God. He got us up in song and dance and helped us to realize that, while we might not have worked with a single homeowner, we met and touched the lives of several people who we wouldn't have otherwise.

The hardest job of the week was working with disabled adults at Goodwill's Discovery Day Center, even though unloading food at the food pantry took a larger physical toll. Working in the community gardens started off boring for some, until they met the single mom who depends on their work to feed her children. Hanging drywall in the bedrooms of a house that was originally built about 100 years ago was also challenging, as there was not a single straight wall. Most enjoyed tearing out plaster and removing old fixtures from the next house and painting a mural was a fun project that drew lots of local media attention.

Report on Annual Conference 2019

Good morning, Church. If you don't know me, my name is Rebekah Daugherty. I currently serve as the Worship Team leader and I sing with Raising Praise. I've been a member here for nine years along with my husband Sean, and both our children were baptized here when they were born.

In June I had the honor of attending our Annual Conference for the first time as one of your Lay Delegates. If, like me, you have not been to Annual Conference before, it is an interesting contrast of two types of gatherings combined in one. On the one hand it is the annual business meeting of the church. We followed Robert's Rules, made motions, called points of order, and took votes. It felt a little perfunctory at times, and not very "church-like". The other, simultaneous and interwoven gathering is the more meaningful one, in my opinion. Yes, it is important to approve the budget and vote for delegates, but it is more significant that we "spur one another on to love and good deeds," that we remind one another what it is to be the church.

We joined in worship together around the theme of "Moving Forward in God's Mission." The scripture for the conference was the Great Commission found in Matthew 28, and messages centered on continuing to go into all the world and make disciples; to remember our calling, and to pursue it in new and bold ways. During our sessions we saw videos of Glory Sightings: testimonies from different ministries around our conference where people are seeing God at work. We also honored those retiring from ministry and we celebrated the ordination of new elders, deacons, and licensed pastors.

Other than getting to watch Rev. Heather be ordained, which we celebrated last month, the most inspiring worship service for me was the closing service. At this service we received the encouraging and challenging words of Bishop Weaver that the mission is not our mission, but God's mission, which we are invited to join and carry on. He reminded us that the church is the instrument and launching pad of God's mission, and we go not for the sake of new members, but for the sake of Christ. I also helped serve Communion alongside Rev. Heather during this service. Watching our congregation here at LUMC come forward to receive Communion is always meaningful to me. Watching a couple thousand people come forward who represented the church from across the state, and to help serve them, was inspiring.

As for the business of the church, the Book of Reports, agenda, meeting minutes, motions, and videos of the proceedings, including the worship and sermons, can be found on the Conference web site, www.vaumc.org. You can find in those documents reports from all the various ministries in the VA Conference, financial statements, statistical reports, and the various nominations to boards and committees that were approved. If you prefer to see a hard copy of the Book of Reports, I am glad to lend you mine.



I would like to share some business items that relate to the current disagreements in the UMC about the inclusion of LGBTQ persons in the church. First I would share that, while there was some tension regarding the topic, all parties were respectful in the proceedings. The presiding bishops encouraged all present to act in grace toward one another, refraining from celebration or excessive applause, and to take into consideration the feelings of those with differing opinions. Everyone took this instruction to heart.

Our first order of business was to elect our delegates to the 2020 General Conference and the Jurisdictional Conference. We elected 22 General Conference delegates, 22 Jurisdictional Conference Delegates, and an additional 20 alternates. All of these

delegates, with the exception of one alternate, are known to identify as progressive or centrist in regards to the inclusion of LGBTQ persons in the church.

Several motions were also put forward regarding church policies relating to homosexual persons. A motion was passed to encourage the Bishops and other Conference leadership to delay any inquiries into clergy conduct related to policies surrounding homosexual persons and marriages until after the 2020 General Conference. Also, motions were passed that petition the 2020 General Conference to remove from the Book of Disciplines what is known as the incompatibility language, the restrictions on the ordination of non-celibate homosexual persons, and the prohibitions on same-sex marriages.

As the UMC continues to discern its future in regard to inclusion of LGBTQ+ persons, I hope you will engage in the discussion here in our church. There was another gathering on July 28th to discuss further these actions of our Annual Conference as well as other developments in response to the 2019 General Conference action, and more are being planned.

If you have questions about the Virginia Annual Conference, please feel free to ask and I will do my best to answer. Judy Craun, Janice Webb, Rev. Heather, and Pastor Jim were also all in attendance and I'm sure would be glad to offer their observations and perspective.

Thank you, again, for sending me as a delegate.
